The taming of journald continues

In his last presentation, Trevor Cordes showed us how to use syslog with journald, and filter out unwanted log lines.

However, those bazillion unwanted lines being filtered out are still being written to disk, causing major wear and tear on your precious, limited-life SSD!

In this follow up presentation, Trevor will discuss minimizing SSD writes and wasted space by using the journald RAMdisk and size-limiting options.

Peertube v5 release

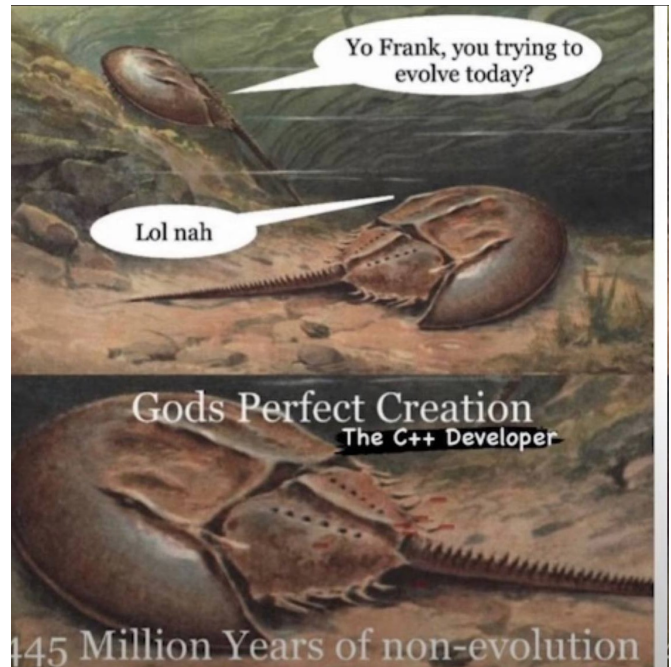
Now supports private videos (unlisted), MFA, and storing streams to cloud storage. Peertube continues to see wide adoption in the Fediverse.
