

Skullspace, 374 Donald St - Suite #200



Just like last December, Mark Jenkins has graciously let us use the Skullspace location at 374 Donald St., for our December meeting. We will be in room 200.

Please note that this location is not mobility accessible. There are 3 flights of stairs and it is 1.5 stories up.

There is no Winnipeg Jets home game on December 5th so downtown street parking should be plentiful. One of the best blocks for street parking is Notre Dame after Hargrave. There is also lots of commercial parking lots in the area including right behind the Skullspace building.

The 66 bus route has a southbound stop on the same block of Donald (useful for departure) in front of the Yellow Dog Tavern. For arrival by bus, it's quite reasonable to walk from stops on Graham and Portage or if taking the 66 get off at northbound Smith at Portage or northbound King at Notre Dame.

Doors will be open starting at 7:15 pm with the meeting starting at 7:30 pm. After 7:45 pm the doors may be locked so you will need to call the Skullspace number (204-480-4092) and we'll answer and come down to let you in.







TUI your scripts with dialog(1)

Add some curses to your bash scripts with dialog!



`Dialog(1)` will let you present a variety of questions or display messages using text only style dialog boxes from a shell script.

The shell is not really intended for large, interactive programs, but using dialog can

make small to moderate interactive programs possible. It provides a useful variety of dialog boxes, allowing many types of user interactions which would be very difficult to implement with the shell alone.

Dialog includes widgets for: buildlist, calendar, checklist, dselect, editbox, form, fselect, gauge, infobox, inputbox, inputmenu, menu, mixedform, mixedgauge, msgbox (message), passwordbox, passwordform, pause, prgbox, programbox, progressbox, radiolist, rangebox, tailboxbg, textbox, timebox, treeview, and yesno (yes/no).


Execution is as simple as:

```
dialog --yesno "Do you want run the command" 10 30
```

If you keep your expectations modest, dialog can be a great tool. The dialog man page is well-written and contains a complete listing of its numerous options. A large set of example programs can be found in your `/usr/share/doc/dialog` directory.
